Hurricane Melissa has crippled infrastructure across Westmoreland and Saint Elizabeth. For thousands, roads to clinics are impassable, the power grid is unreliable, and homes have been destroyed, cutting them off from essential medical care and safe shelter.







Access Denied

Physical barriers prevent patients from reaching stationary medical facilities and families from returning home.



Infrastructure Lost

Unreliable electricity and water render remaining clinics and homes inoperable and unsafe.

We cannot heal a community that has nowhere to sleep, and we cannot rebuild a community that is too sick to work. Our recovery effort is built on two integrated pillars that restore both immediate health and long-term stability.

Deploy a rugged, self-sufficient mobile medical and dental clinic to deliver hospital-grade care directly to isolated communities.

Pillar 1: The Health Lifeline is a Clinic Built for the Challenge.

After extensive research, we have identified the ideal solution: the TESCO 40ft Freightliner S2C Mobile Medical Unit. This is not a retrofitted RV; it is a commercial-grade clinic with a steel body construction built directly on the chassis, designed for heavy-duty medical operations in demanding environments.



Reach

Built to access isolated populations on compromised terrain.



Capability

A multi-room clinic equipped for diverse medical needs, from triage to chronic care.



Resilience

Designed to function entirely off-grid, independent of local power and water.




Engineered to Endure Jamaica's Toughest Conditions



Heavy-Duty Construction:


A steel cage shell is mounted directly to the chassis, primered with rust inhibitor to withstand tropical climates. Fundamentally different from RVs not designed for sustained operational use.

All-Terrain Readiness: Equipped with Air Ride Suspension, all-weather tires, and dual 40-gallon fuel tanks to maximize range and navigate varied terrain.



A Three-Room Layout to Maximize Patient Throughput.

The unit's three private rooms allow for simultaneous triage, examination, and treatment, creating an efficient workflow for our medical teams and dramatically increasing the number of people we can serve each day.

A 5.5 cu ft Medical Grade Refrigerator runs on a constantly hot, dedicated circuit, vital for preserving the integrity of vaccines, insulin, and antibiotics in Jamaica's tropical heat.



Sterile & Secure Workspaces

Durable Corian countertops, locking upper and lower cabinets, and under-cabinet LED lighting provide a clean, secure environment for medical procedures.



Integrated Safety Systems

Outfitted with an eye wash station, sharps disposal, smoke & CO detectors, and a 24-unit first aid kit.








Total Self-Sufficiency When Infrastructure Fails

The unit is a self-contained operational hub, engineered to function for extended periods without reliance on local utilities.



Onboard: A self-contained plumbing system with fresh and black water tanks and an electric monitoring system supports a full lavatory and heated sinks.

Pillar 2: A Foundation for the Future - Secure, Permanent Homes.

Medical care keeps people alive, but a safe home keeps them healthy. To address the housing crisis left by Hurricane Melissa, we are partnering with Island Imports Jamaica to deploy 20×20 ft modular container homes. These are not temporary shelters; they are permanent, turnkey structures designed to withstand the Caribbean climate.

Cost per unit: JMD \$3,900,000 / Approx. USD \$25,000 (provides a permanent, secure sanctuary for one family).

Layout: 1-2 Bedrooms, Kitchen, Bathroom, Living & Dining Area.

Deployment: Can be delivered and assembled on-site within 6–8 weeks of funding.

Each home is engineered with materials and design principles specifically chosen for long-term durability and safety in a hurricane-prone region.



Heavy-Duty Structure

Reinforced structural steel framing provides exceptional strength and superior wind resistance compared to traditional structures.



Anchored Foundation System

Units are securely anchored to a concrete foundation, reducing the risk of shifting or lifting during high winds.



Insulated & Resistant Walls

EPS concrete panels provide excellent insulation, sound reduction, and crucial fire and moisture resistance to prevent mold.



Impact Resistance

Durable roofing and wall panels, plus impact-resistant windows and secure steel doors, are designed to hold up against flying debris.
